Death Planning



## Last Will and Testament

States how you want your property to pass at your death, who you appoint as your Independent Executor and who will take care of your minor children upon your death.

## Statutory Durable Power of Attorney of Attorney

Allows you to name who you want to make business and financial decisions for you in the event of incapacity or disability.

## Durable Power of Attorney

Allows you to name who you want to make your medical and health care decisions for you in the event of your incapacity or disability.

Incapacity Planning



## Directive to Physician (Living Will)

Declares your wishes with respect to life-prolonging treatments and procedures.

## Designation of Guardian

Allows you to name the individuals who you want and who you do not want to be the guardian of your person and estate in the event of your incapacity or disability.

## Designation of Guardian for Minor Children

Allows you to name the individuals who will be the guardian of your children in the event of your incapacity or disability.

## HIPAA Authorization

Permits you to name individuals to have access to your medical information and records.

## Disposition of Remains

Allows you to appoint an agent to make all decisions about the disposition of your remains after death.
