Who gets the Ring in a Divorce?



In a divorce, the engagement ring is considered the separate property of the person it was gifted to unless there is a legal agreement between the parties in place.

In Texas, separate property is defined as anything that was owned prior to the marriage, gifted during the marriage, or inherited during the marriage. Thus, after you marry the person who gave you the ring, you have fulfilled your promise to marry and it is your separate property.

2 hrs 10 min

INGREDIENTS

- Cooking spray
- 2 3/4 c. chocolate chips
- 1 (14-oz.) can sweetened condensed milk
- 2 tbsp. heavy cream
- 4 tbsp. butter
- 1 tsp. pure vanilla extract
- 1/4 tsp. kosher salt
- 3 tbsp. Christmas sprinkles

DIRECTIONS

1. Line an 8"-x-8" baking pan with parchment paper and grease with cooking spray. In a medium saucepan over medium heat, melt chocolate, condensed milk, butter, cream, vanilla, and salt together. Stir until smooth then pour into prepared pan.
2. Top with sprinkles and refrigerate until set, 2 hours. Cut into squares to serve.


