Michigan Man Forced To Split \$80 Million Dollar Lottery Winnings With Ex Wife

> Based on a recent article by the Washington Post, a man in Michigan won a \$80 million dollar lottery jackpot and was forced to split it with his ex-wife.

> "Rich was lucky - but it was his luck, not Mary's, that produced the lottery proceeds." *

> Although there were other contributing factors to this case in Michigan, imagine what would happen if you were in Texas. Here is the the timeline of events:

- Man separates from wife in 2013.
- Man buys lottery ticket.
- Man divorces wife in 2018.

So, who gets the money?

The state of Texas does *not* recognize legal separation. Even if you live apart from your spouse for an extended period of time, your spouse will still be entitled to your earnings, or lottery winnings, during the time you lived apart until the day your divorce is finalized.

It's beneficial to finalize your divorce prior to any large financial windfall, even if you don't play the lottery.

The moral of the story: If you are separated from your spouse or potentially have unknowingly entered into a common law marriage, understand the laws in your state before buying that lottery ticket.

How Do I Know If I am Common Law Married?

Some people think that if a couple lives together for a certain period of time or if a couple has children together, they are automatically in a common law marriage. This is not the case.

To have a common law marriage in Texas, a couple must:

- Agree to be married;
- Live together in Texas as husband and wife: and
- Represent to others that they are married.

A couple has 2 years starting from the date they stopped living together to prove a common law marriage.

Who Cannot Enter Into a Common Law Marriage?

A person is unable to enter into a common law marriage if they are presently married or under the age of 18.

Probate is the act of proving that a Will was signed and executed in accordance with the legal requirements as set out in the State where it was signed. Probate also includes:



Paying debts and taxes



Property appraisal



Finding documents to settle the estate



Distributing property as the Will directs

The best way to avoid probate is by having an estate plan. Including the following in your estate plan can help your loved ones avoid probate.



Listing Transfer on Death (TOD) or Payable on Death (POD) on checking & savings accounts, annuities, retirement, CD's, or other investments.



Appointing a quardian for your child or children that are under the age of 18.



Setting up a Revocable Trust. Upon death, the trustee vou choose will distribute property.
